Big Ben, Parliament, Westminster, Buckingham Palace, Tower of London, Tower Bridge, the London Eye. Today will be familiar territory for you, not necessarily because you've physically been here before, but because the images of these icons are so essential to what we know about England, they are unforgettable. They are time-honored. They are universally identifiable. They are precious to the people who own them.

But none are indestructible.

At some point in history, they will crumble either because they were constructed with degradable materials or because the enemies of those icons will destroy them. Either way, they are coming down.

Christianity has its own icons. They are the doctrines, the truths of our faith that define what we believe

and the very person of God. These icons are the eternality of the Godhead, the work of Christ on the cross because of the wickedness of all who would believe, the Resurrection which gave eternal victory over death, justification, sanctification, the inerrancy of scripture, the return of Christ. As your eyes soak in the architecture, and your ears hear the history, as your appreciation for the richness of the British infrastructure grows today, make the spiritual connection to our own icons. Delight in them, have confidence in them, but take it to another level....

Live the truth of them. We are walking icons of our faith. Allow the lost world to look at you, have a clear understanding of Who you represent, stand in awe of our God and then repent, embrace the cross and enjoy...
